

PARK & PIPE PERFORMANCE PATHWAY HOME NATIONS Selection 2018 – 2019

INTRODUCTION

The Park & Pipe Pathway is designed to support selected athletes to train, and where appropriate compete, in national and international environments for their Home Nation and GB. Athletes must commit to developing their fitness, all- mountain riding, slopestyle, half pipe, big air and acrobatics and be motivated to succeed. It is vital that there is support from parents and coaches but it's also essential that athletes have a strong work ethic to realise their potential in the programme. Athletes are expected to train and compete in appropriate slopestyle, big air and half pipe events and it is expected that athletes engage with a local gymnastics, free-running or acrobatics club to support their development.

Athletes selected to the Park & Pipe Pathway will be expected to work with their respective Home Nations and local coaches and engage with the relevant Championship and Ski & Snowboard scene.

Athletes selected to the Park & Pipe Pathway will be led by British Ski and Snowboard with support from their respective Home Nation.

Selection to the Park & Pipe Pathway in either the Home Nation program or British Ski & Snowboard program is not a guarantee that athletes will be invited on camps taking place abroad. Invitations to camps will be awarded on skill level and stage of progression.

Finally, this document relates to the Selection Criteria for Home Nations (Wales, England and Scotland). GB Park and Pipe / BSS will publish further selection criteria related to the Main Team Programmes. Athletes who are considered for this level will be automatically put forward for consideration by the Home Nations Selection Panel. SELECTION POLICY

This policy is for selection to the Park & Pipe Performance Pathway and shall apply with effect from the date of publication until further notice.

AIMS OF THE SELECTION POLICY

- To ensure transparency and accountability in the selection process.
- To ensure a fair and just criteria and practices are employed for the selection of Pathway athletes.
- To support the overall competition and development objectives of Snowsport Scotland, Snowsport England, Snowsport Wales and British Ski & Snowboard.

SELECTION PROCESS

- The Home Nations operate an open selection policy throughout the year, with a designated selection
 window each year following the BRITS Championships. This means athletes may apply anytime in the
 year, however there will be no automatic re-selection of existing Performance Pathway athletes in
 April each year.
- The selection criteria for the Performance Pathway will be published on the Home Nation websites towards the end of each calendar year with the selection window for applications closing the following year prior to the BRITS Championships.
- The criteria will be updated annually and in order to be considered for selection athletes must:
 - complete the online application form with your respective Home Nation,











- provide a copy of individual traffic lights and,
- provide links to video footage of recent performance.
- The Home Nations selectors will nominate athletes for selection to the Park & Pipe Pathway, which will also give them automatic consideration for GB Team selection. Park & Pipe Pathway nominations will be made based on the coaches' judgement of whether an athlete will reach Main Team selection level within 12-18 months based on the current selection criteria.
- Selected athletes will be notified no later than May of each year.
- New applicants to the Home Nations Performance Pathway may need to attend a technical
 assessment event with Performance Pathway Coaches to evaluate technical ability, both on and off
 the snow.

SELECTION CRITERIA

All selections will be based on the following:

- Technical skill performance levels using current performance profiling with considerations given to athlete age.
- Local or private coach's report and recommendations
- Positive or negative improvement trends
- Fitness level
- Psychological attitude and willingness to train on and off the snow

Any athlete can submit footage of their skill. They must submit evidence that they meet the selection criteria. In conjunction with these technical criteria, applicants must:

- Be registered as a current competitor/performer for the 2017/18 season with one of the Home
 Nations
- Agree to and sign the Code of Conduct, undertake a Concussion Protocol and adhere to Camp Booking Policy.
- Behave in a considerate, polite and courteous manner.

Technical Skill

Our programme has a focus on technical performance and we use multiple profiling systems to monitor athletes engaged in our programme. The below performance profile charts reflect the technical skill level required to access the program dependant on age. We stress here technical level is one aspect of selection and other criteria as outlined above is taken into account meaning selection is not purely reliant on these factors but it is a prime consideration.

The Traffic Lights are a monitoring tool used by coaches and athletes to profile technical progression. They are RAG rated with; Red, tricks tried but not consistent; Amber, consistent but not yet fully controlled to demonstrate refinement; Green, well refined with ability to demonstrate creativity and variation through tweaks, grabs with a high level of consistency in multiple environments. Sizes are; Piste, On piste where athlete is required to generate lift with no kicker; Small, Up to 5m. Usually with little or no step down and found at most UK artificial slopes; Medium, Around 10m. Sometimes found indoors in the UK, but usually at snowflex dryslopes or mountains; Large; Around 15m and only found in the mountains. Usually abroad, but occasionally in Scotland; Pro, 20m+ in select world class parks abroad.




























The performance of the trick at the specified level is required to be a solid, controlled rotation with a strong grab and landed on the whole ski / board. This should be a refined skill and ready for inclusion in competition as per 'green' on Traffic Lights.

This is to be supported by the individual athletes traffic lights, which should show an appropriate depth of skills in addition to the specified trick.

The above Traffic Lights indicate a multi-directional approach to skills development and suitably support the skill level plotted on the Performance Chart.



The Traffic Lights shown above indicate a linear development of an athlete and would not support the multidirectional capacity required for an athlete to be selected to the Park & Pipe Pathway.

COMMITMENT EXPECTATIONS

Athletes are expected to agree to a programme of training with a recognised provider (including but not limited to Home Nation Governing Body (HNGB)/BSS programmes) once selected. Athletes are expected to commit to this programme of activity which will include (domestic) on-snow training, Athletic Capacity Training, gymnastics and acrobatics. HNGB's and BSS reserve the right to contact external training providers to track progress. Athletes are expected to demonstrate commitment toward the program, their own performance and the performance of their fellow athletes. Engagement through personal performance or assistance (if needed) in creating training environments facilitated by Home Nations and/or British Ski and Snowboard as outlined above is mandatory.











CODE OF CONDUCT

All athletes will be required to sign and abide by a Code of Conduct, Concussion Protocol and Camp Booking Conditions. Agreement to all of these will be required to submit the online application form.

FORMATION AND MEMBERS OF SELECTION COMMITTEE

The Chairperson of the Selection Committee may invite others with specialist knowledge to contribute for part of a meeting depending on the availability of the individual members and the specific areas for which it is selecting. Committee members should be free from external conflicts of interest in the selection process.

NON-SELECTION

Athletes who have not been selected following an application will be notified by email by their respective Home Nation Governing Body. Reasons for non-selection will be given and guidance on what areas need improvement will be given.

APPEALS PROCESS

The Park & Pipe Pathway appeals process is structured to conform to UK Sport guidelines. All appeals must be made in writing, with accompanying evidence and additional information addressed Private and Confidential to the CEO and relevant performance staff at each athletes respective Home Nation Governing Body.

For the Park & Pipe Pathway selections, appeals must be made within 7 days of the individual email notification.

All appeals will be considered on an individual basis. Appeals will initially be reconsidered by the original selection committee, who will explain the reasons for their decision to the athlete. If the athlete is not happy with the process or the outcome of the selection committee's final decision, the athlete may then opt to refer the matter to an internal appeals committee. The Park & Pipe Pathway appeals Chairman will constitute an internal appeals' committee consisting of at least three people who did not sit on the original selection committee.

If the dispute remains unresolved, it will be submitted for an exclusive, final and binding determination to the Sports Dispute Resolution Panel (Sports Resolutions. Snowsport Scotland, Snowsport England, Snowsport Wales and British Ski and Snowboard understands that both parties will undertake to execute any decision of Sports Resolutions).
