Chill Factor^e Event Rules

FAILURE TO ADHERE TO THESE RULES COULD RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION FROM THE EVENT

- **BAGS**; All guest <u>bags must be stored in unit 15 at all times</u>. Any bags left on or under benches in the changing village or blocking exits will be removed by Chill Factor^e staff.
- ❖ TICKETS; Chill Factor^e will issue event tickets to each competitor at bib issue. Chillfactore will print the tickets the day before the event and CD will pass them on to the event organisers. These <u>tickets MUST be used</u> to gain access to the slope through the airlock doors in the changing village AT ALL TIMES. Jumping over, climbing past or ducking under the turnstiles is not allowed under any circumstances.
- SKIS AND BOARDS; Ski's and boards must be stored in the ski racks provided by Chill Factor^e in the snowplay area or in unit 15. Alternatively equipment can be left along the back wall of the event side (poma 2) of the main slope. equipment must not at any time be left blocking any other snow side activity, entrance and door ways or fire equipment. Any equipment left not in the racks or on the correct race side of the main slope will be removed by Chill Factor^e staff or event organisers.
- **CHANGING VILLAGE & UNIT 15;** unit 15 has been reserved for use by the competitors and event organisers. **Competitors must store all equipment in unit 15 throughout the day.**
- ❖ BIBS; Race bibs issued to each racer must be worn at all times when in the changing village or snow side to ensure they are easily visible.
- **BOOTS;** NO Ski or Snowboard boots are allowed upstairs at any time.
- ❖ SPECTATORS; Competitors when not competing and all event spectators can wait and view the race from Chilli's bar. Own food and beverages must not be consumed within any of the tenants own Café or restaurant seating areas. Provisional timetable

The 2015 English Indoor Ski/Snowboard Moguls Championships will take place on Saturday 16th of May, 2015 at Chill Factore, Manchester.

Eligibility Criteria

The event is open to all athletes who are registered as a performer with a Home Nation (Snowsport England/Snowsport Scotland/Snowsport Wales) and to all members of clubs who are affiliated with a Home Nation.

Athletes who wish to compete who are not registered with a Home Nation or a member of an affiliated club can pay an additional fee of £5 for a daily registration which needs to be paid on the day at the time of registration.

The maximum field size is 120 athletes.

Single Olympic Format

The event will be run using the Olympic Format which is deemed to be the fairest system for all athletes.

From Qualification 1 the top 8 athletes will progress straight to the final. All other competitors will progress to qualification 2.

After qualification 2 the top 8 will also progress to the final.

Final 1 will be he top 16 competitors with the top 6 progressing to the super final

The Super final will determine the overall winner.

Duals

The dual moguls will be run under the same conditions as the single moguls to determine the top 16. The top 16 will then dual.

Overall English Champion title

The title of English Champion will be awarded to whoever has the highest score irrespective of their age category. Medals for age categories will be awarded from the final overall results.

The format to be used for the English Moguls Championships will be Olympic format.

Below is a simple explanation of how things will work.

All age groups will compete together.

Winners of age categories will only be determined after the competition has been completed and will be taken from the final results list. Anyone not making finals or small finals will have the highest result from qualification 1 or qualification 2 used to calculate their age category result.

Single Moguls

Qualification 1

- •Top 8 competitors from Qualification 1 progress straight to the Small Final.
- •All other competitors have a second run in Qualification 2.

Qualification 2

- •The top 8 from qualification 2 progress to the Small Final
- All competitors outside the top 8 do not progress further in the competition


Small Fina

•The Super final determines the, Gold Silver and Bronze medals.

The top 16 after qualification 2 will determine the seed list for dual moguls pairings. The aim is that the two best skiers would meet in the final. The highest ranked would meet the lowest ranked, In the knockout rounds
